

Below are Common Law Constitutional Rights belonging to the English

The Right of the Realm of England and its Subjects to defend themselves.

The Right to a Jury.

The Right to remain silent.

The Right to Govern ourselves via County, District and Parish Councils.

The Right of Property Freehold.

The Right to earn a living.

The Right to full freedom of navigation and trade.

The Right to bring up and protect our Children.

The Right of Habeas Corpus.

That the pretended Power of Suspending of Laws is illegal.

The Right to Assert English antient Rights and Liberties.

That the pretended Power of Dispensing with Laws is illegal.

The Right to Petition the Monarch, Commitments and Prosecutions for such Petitioning are Illegal.

That Election of Members of Parliament ought to be free.

That levying Money (Income Tax, VAT a European Tax) is illegal.

Commissioners for Ecclesiastical Causes and all other Commissions and Courts of like nature (Sharia) are Illegal and Pernicious.

That all Grants and Promises of Fines and Forfeitures of particular persons before Conviction are illegal and void nor excessive Fines imposed nor cruel and unusual Punishments inflicted.

And that for Redress of all Grievances and for the amending strengthening and preserving of the Lawes Parliaments ought to be held frequently.

That no Foreign Prince Person Prelate, State or Potentate hath or ought to have any Jurisdiction Power Superiority Pre-eminence or Authority Ecclesiastical or Spiritual within this Realm So help me God.

The People of England have the right to self-determination under International LAW

The Right of Self-Determination: Article 1

Texts -

International Instruments International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR);

International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (ICESCR)

Article 1

- (1) All peoples have the right of self-determination. By virtue of that right they freely determine their political status and freely pursue their economic, social and cultural development.
- (2) All peoples may, for their own ends, freely dispose of their natural wealth and resources without prejudice to any obligations arising out of international economic co-operation, based upon the principle of mutual benefit, and international law. In no case may a people be deprived of its own means of subsistence.
- (3) The States Parties to the present Covenant, including those having responsibility for the administration of Non-Self-Governing and Trust Territories, shall promote the realization of the right of self-determination, and shall respect that right, in conformity with the provisions of the Charter of the United Nations.
